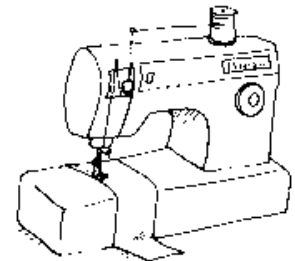

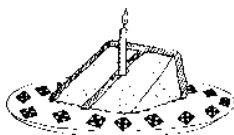

Standing Rule #7 Follow-Up - Pat Pillot

On September 17, 2009, CAMEO Guild members voted to amend Standing Rule #7 allowing for exceptions to the closed nature of the December and June pot luck meetings: "December and June business meeting/pot luck are for current active and associate members. Exceptions may be made with notification to a current member and the President."

Here is a brief summary of the guidelines the board agreed will be considered by the president when accepting a request for a guest to attend the meetings:

- The capacity of the venue at for the event.
- Does the guest share some interest in quilting?
- Is this person a guest in your home, visiting from out of the area (state, country etc) ?
- Is the guest a former member who has moved?
- Has this person applied for membership for the coming year?
- Has the president been notified by a member at least one week before the event of the request to bring a guest?

The current guest fee of \$5.00 will be asked of the member bringing the guest to assist in covering guild expenses for the event. (A member's dues covers these expenses) The member will be asked to be sure her pot luck dish will accommodate an extra person or two.

The guest will be given a special name tag when they sign in.

Generally speaking, someone who lives locally would not be considered an "extenuating circumstance" because they can attend any of the other meetings, which are always open to guests.

Today's patchwork: fresh, fun, and modern - From Quilting Arts at www.quiltingarts.com

Until recently, "patchwork" brought to mind only antique quilts or blue and brown calico Sunbonnet Sues from the '70s. It was not a word that popped up often in the art quilter's lexicon.

But lately, patchwork has been making a comeback—with modern twists. And here's a little secret: it's an easy way for new quilters to make a sophisticated-looking quilt or accessory in no time and a great way for more experienced quilt designers to play with color and use all their beautiful scraps in a fresh style.

Hallmarks of the modern patchwork trend:

- * Big-square color blocking for a bold statement (bright colors or black and white)
- * Japanese influence—circles, diamonds, long rectangles, and hexagons with unexpected color combinations
- * Fabrics from young, new designers—in retro '60s and '70s colors and patterns
- * Bohemian chic—combining India prints, batiks, and other ethnic fabrics and patterns
- * Turning traditional patch patterns on their heads with raw, frayed edges, asymmetrical patches, and big blocks.

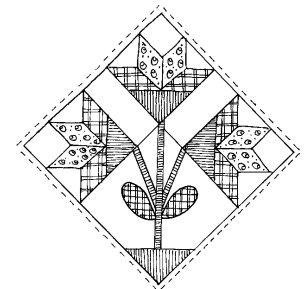

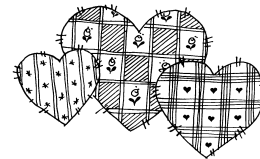
