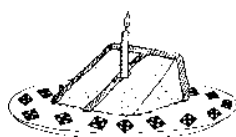

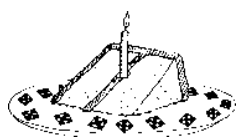

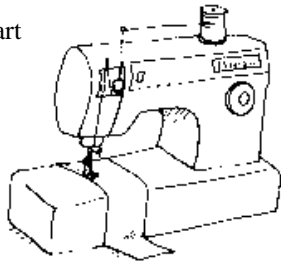

## From Jean Forrester...

Dear CAMEO members – Our finished quilt, which took ten women a year to create, is touring the first of its many raffle sale stops. Sandy Peiss says tickets are selling well! More than once I've been asked if there will be a pattern available? The answer is Yes, but not until just before our 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show. Time to create a saleable pattern has been severely reduced due to my return to work last February. Having never written or published a quilt pattern before, you are all invited to become of my process. I'm offering to run portions of it in our newsletter (space permitting) which will include just the corner bouquet pattern pieces and rudimentary instructions. I welcome your comments, criticisms and suggestions as this goes along.

This quilt and its resultant beauty would not have been possible without the inspiration, perspiration and dedication of the nine other women on the committee: Chantal Anderson, Pat Baldauf, Jean Becher, Sara Bush, Margaret Crouch, Carol Gilbert, Carol Fetsco, Maggie Smith and Dorothy Strefling. The goal was simple; to create a unique and uniquely beautiful raffle quilt to promote quilting and our 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show like no other. I contributed original drawings and full-sized cartoons from which the quilt templates were created. All the fabrics were purchased from local businesses and/or contributed from the stashes of the committee members. Certain fabrics were created by Sara Bush - an entire rainbow of hand dyed shades plus hand painted fabrics which we used for the Roses and many other elements. Dorothy and I created a raw edge, fused mock-up of the proposed colors for the corner from some fabrics before decisions were made for the whole quilt by the committee.

I'd highly recommend doing the same for your quilt if you intend to make one. The corner bouquets are roughly 20" x 20" finished size. The corners are mirror images based on a single drawing. Variations are produced by where you choose to place certain blooms. Initially, trace this design, petal by petal onto template plastic or freezer paper depending upon your choice of appliqué method. Make slash marks to indicate where one pattern piece overlaps another. If you choose to use classic hand-turned stitching, add 1/4" seam allowances. If using fusible raw edge techniques add extra fabric only to those petals or leaves that will tuck under other design elements.

### First up ð the Iris.

Cutting suggestions: After tracing each individual pattern piece onto either template plastic or freezer paper consider some fun color choices.

#### Iris Petals:

I-1 and I-2 petals should be cut from a lighter shade fabric than what is used for I-3. I-4 through I-6 can be a combination. Ideally, select a fabric which has some striated colors in varying hues. The 'beards' are best applied to the Iris fabrics before the petals are cut.

#### Stems:

Stems can be made as tubes of fabric and applied with the seam pressed to the back of the tube, then sewn in place.

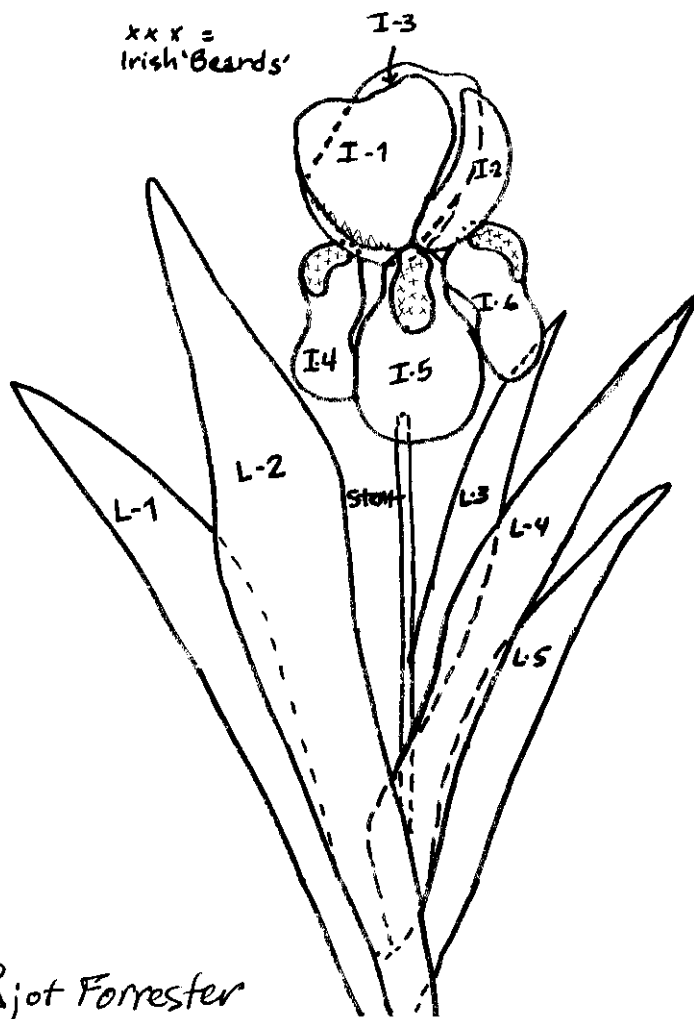
#### Leaves:

Leaves need to vary in shades of green to look more dimensional.

If you are experimenting with this alone, trace the entire pattern onto a white or cream muslin first for ease of lay-out when stitching. Feel free to copy it larger than the stated dimensions if necessary to practice fusible applique methods.

I'm not going to repeat Applique Methods that have already been taught in so many sessions last year and which exist in countless excellent books. Our method was to use heat resistant plastic for the templates, spray starch, tweezers and an iron to prepare our pieces.

Note: Artwork needs to be enlarged 200% to measure 10" long by 7" wide. Accuracy of enlarging varies with copy machines so you may wish to have your ruler handy to double check the size.
